Hey Now! There's another Unbroken Chain that's been around for a long time - the chain of highways that links all those great places that this country has to offer. For me, there's no greater adventure in travel on those highways than hitchhiking, and in the nineteen years I've been doing it, I've had a hellacious time and a lot of wild experiences, many of the 'small world' kind. Most recently, I was hitchin' out to California for the New Year's shows-all was smooth (for December, that is) until I got to the desert, where rides can be slow and cops can be frequent. Biddy Mulligan, a music bar at the city's northernmost edge, is not the sort of place one expects to encounter a cultural phenomenon. We had come to hear a friend's brother play in a band called Stephen's Answer and as we sat in the bar we heard a young fellow say, "The Dead live!" We sat and listened to a number of Grateful Dead songs, as well as an original tune and a Beatles cover and all the while used to figure out the lasting influence and popularity of the Grateful Dead, more than 20 years old and still capable of inspiring musicians as young as the six members of Stephen's Answer.

"I think it's because not only is the music solid, it also provides the opportunity for collective improvisation," said Jim Beznos, the band's mainstay player.

On the way out we noted that two other Grateful Dead tribute bands, The Deadbeats and Uncle John's Band, were on Biddy Mulligan's schedule.

And a few days later, thumbing through Business Week, we found this item in a lengthy story about Apple Computer, Inc.: "Apple engineers recently entertained members of the Grateful Dead, who now compose some of their songs with the help of Macintosh."

No cash, no car, manager tells Carter's daughter

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (UPI) — An auto salvage yard manager says it is his policy not to accept checks for impounded cars — even from the children of former presidents.

Mike Russo, manager of Citizens Auto Body on the Providence-Johnston line, said former President Jimmy Carter's daughter Amy dropped by Tuesday to pick up her car, which had been towed last month for non-payment of parking fines.

Miss Carter, 19, offered a personal check to pay the storage charges on the car, Russo said. But he told her to come back with cash.

"I can't accept checks," Russo said. "I don't know if I'll ever see the girl again."

Russo said Friday that Miss Carter had not been back. Calls placed to the auto yard yesterday went unanswered and Miss Carter was unavailable for comment.

Russo wouldn't say how much in storage fees is owed on the maroon 1983 Mercury Capri, which is slightly dented, and which bears a green-and-white Georgia plate and a black-and-white picture of the Grateful Dead rock band on its rear.

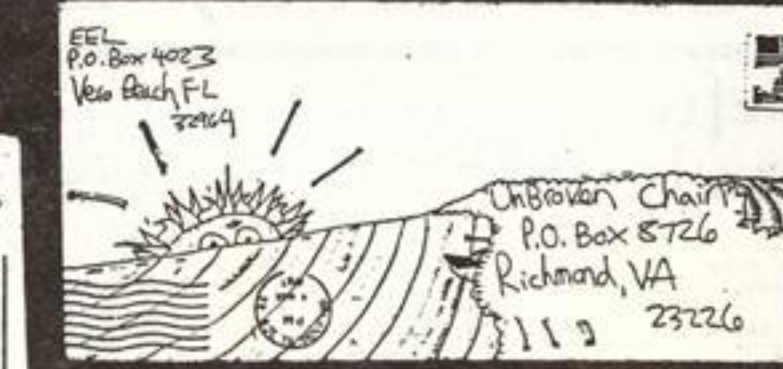

Telluride's eager for Grateful Dead

Mid following of fans is music history. "Dead heads," as fans call themselves, have been known to trail the group to every stop on its annual concert tours. Many think nothing of driving days on end to prove their devotion to the band.

Bill Graham Presents, the San Francisco-based promoter, has yet to acquire permits and will be asked to sign a standard contract detailing responsibility for parking, security, facilities and camping.

Telluride organizers gave a lot of thought to having "the right mix" of people in town for the concert, Reid said.

"We weren't sure they would mix all that well with the Ideas Festival people," said Reid, "although the wild mushroom people said they'd love to have the Grateful Dead in town the same weekend as their festival."

Last year at Denver's Red Rocks amphitheater, which lead guitarist Jerry Garcia has called one of the band's favorite places to play, three \$,000-seat shows sold out within days.

"Who knows how many people would come," said Reid. "Grateful Dead people come whether they have tickets or not."

It will be an ordinary concert. The group has accumulated many hits in its 21-year career, maintaining the 60's traditions of psychedelia and hard-core rock.
