

PROVIDENCE, R.I. (UPI) - An auto salvage yard manager says it is his policy not to accept checks for impounded cars - even from the children of former presidents.


Mike Russo, manager of Citizens Auto Body on the Providence-Johnston line, said former President Jimmy Carter's daughter Amy dropped by Tuesday to pick up her car, which had been towed last month for nonpayment of parking fines.

Miss Carter, 19, offered a personal check to pay the storage charges on the car, Russo said. But he told her to come back with cash.

"I can't accept checks," Russo said. "I don't know if I'll ever see the girl again."

Russo said Friday that Miss Carter had not been back. Calls placed to the auto yard yesterday went unanswered and Miss Carter was unavailable for comment.

Russo wouldn't say how much in storage fees is owed on the maroon 1983 Mercury Capri, which is slightly dented, and which bears a green-and white Georgia plate and a black-andwhite picture of the Grateful Dead rock band on its rear.


