The Grateful Dead are what San Francisco is. While other groups became identified with the San Francisco sound before the Dead, they were the forerunners. In the following paragraphs from *The Electric Kool Aid Acid Test*, Tom Wolfe describes them.

"'Acid rock' — the sound of the Beatles' Sergeant Pepper album and the high-vibrato electronic sounds of the Jefferson Airplane, Mothers of Invention and many other groups—the mothers of it all were the Grateful Dead . . ."

"There was something wholly new and deliriously wierd in the Dead's sound, and practically everything new in rock 'n' roll, rock jazz I have heard it called, came out of it."

Grateful Dead is comprised of Jerry Garcia (lead guitar), Robert Weir (rhythm guitar), Phil Lesh (bass), Ron "Pig-Pen" McKernan (vocals), William Kreutzman and Mickey Hart (drums) and Tom Constanten (keyboards).
