GRATEFUL DEAD

Grateful Dead includes Jerry Garcia (lead guitar), Bob Weir (rhythm guitar), Phil Lesh (bass), Ron "Pigpen" McKernan (keyboard, vocals) and Bill Kreutzman and Mickey Hart (percussion). The group began in 1964 when Jerry, Pigpen and Bob started performing around San Francisco as Mother McCree's Uptown Jug Champions. With the addition of Phil Lesh and Bill Kreutzman, the group became the Warlocks. By the time they began to call themselves the Grateful Dead, they had become prime movers in the flowering of the San Francisco rock scene. They took on a second drummer, Mickey Hart, and proceeded to cultivate a dedicated, "underground" following. Since the release of their latest LP, Workingman's Dead, record sales charts have indicated either that the members of their "underground" following are each purchasing three or four copies of the album, or that — finally — some "overground" rock fans have discovered the Grateful Dead. For numerology freaks: this is Grateful Dead's eighth engagement at Fillmore East.

NEW RIDERS OF THE PURPLE SAGE

New Riders consists of Jerry Garcia (pedal steel guitar), Mickey Hart (drums), John "Marmaduke" Dawson (vocals, rhythm guitar), David Torbert (bass) and David Nelson (lead guitar, mandolin).

JOE'S LIGHTS

The members of Joe's Lights spent this past summer creating a show they called "Aurora Musicale," which they performed through August at the Lanterna Magica Theatre at Expo '70 in Montreal. Later this year they will tour the USA, performing in concert with major symphony orchestras. The show is performed by Bill Schwarzbach, Cecily Hony, Thomas Shoesmith, Dennis Clark and Allan Arkush, with a little help from their friends Eddie Chin, Amalie Rothschild and Barbie Rudish.

ROCK RELICS AUCTION

On Monday, October 12 (Columbus Day), a unique collection of articles will be auctioned at Fillmore East, beginning at 7:00 PM. A general admission of \$1.50 will be collected at the door, to be donated (along with the proceeds from the auctionsale) to the advertising campaigns of the 1970 peace candidates.

Many of the articles for sale might at first appear to be singularly uninteresting: a cast-off gold lamé ascot tie, a broken drum-head, a splintered half of a guitar-body, an out-of-fuel disposable cigarette-lighter and a vial containing a few dried rose petals. These objects perhaps become more significant when it is known that the tie belonged to Fats Domino, the drum-head to B. J. Wilson, the half guitar-body to Peter Townshend, the cigarette-lighter to Keith Moon and the dried rose petals (while still attached to a fresh blossom) to Mick Jagger.

Other items for sale have greater tangible value. One is a flute that belonged to lan Anderson. Another is a 1966 Cadillac limousine which, while serving as "flagship" for Cabaret Limousine Service, conveyed the Beatles, Cream, Jefferson Airplane and many other notable rock groups and individual artists.

Several rock artists will attend the auction, some of whom will perform and others of whom will present articles they donated to the people who purchase them. The collection is still being augmented, and artists who aren't yet represented by a souvenir are being solicited to donate one. We don't have anything from Cynthia Plastercaster yet, but we're working on it. (Tim Hicks)
