

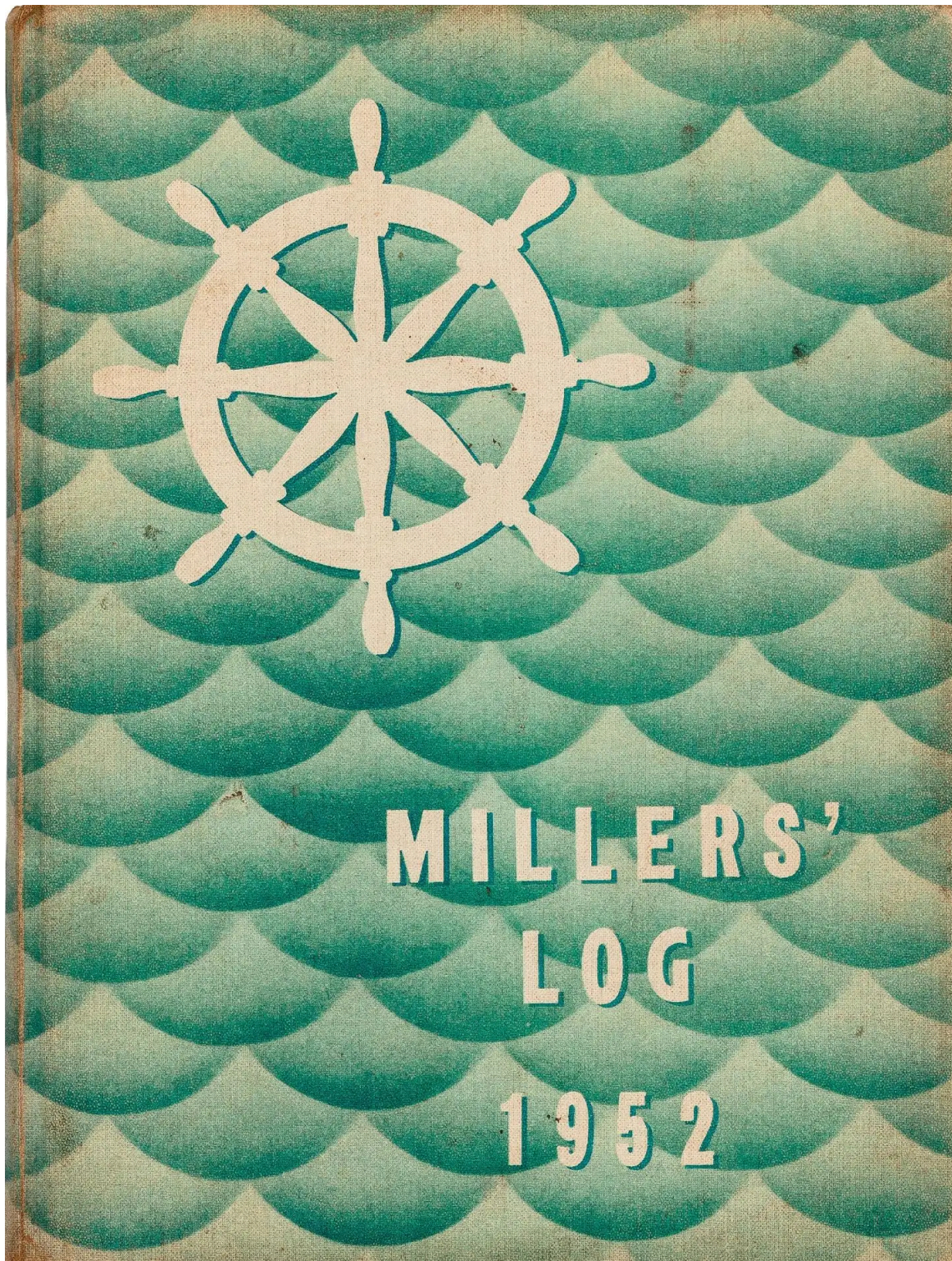

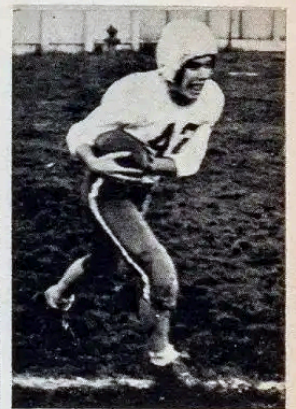

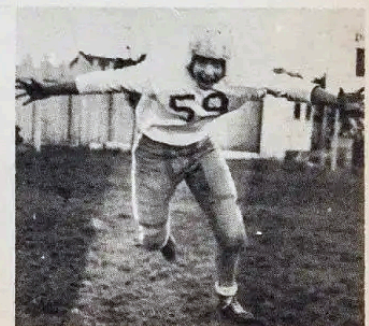

Grapplers Have Fair Season

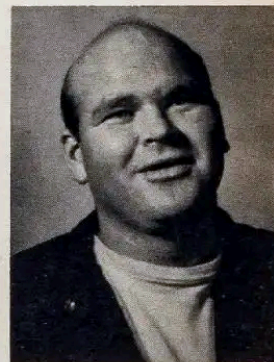
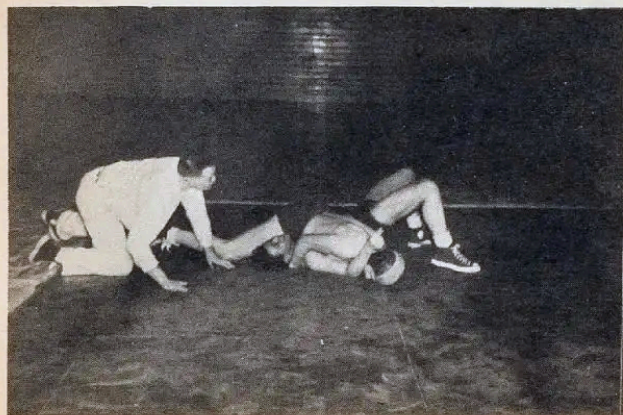
In tournament competition the season's record shows that the Millers placed third in the Big-Six, fifth in the District, and qualified five men for the State meet at Corvallis where Mel Hollister's fourth place in the ninety-six pound class gave the Miller matmen a tie with Albany for thirteenth place out of more than thirty participating schools.

Considering the fact that the Miller Matmen had only one returning letterman, they had a very good season. The grapplers, led by Captain Doug Williams, senior; Dick Tirrell and Ken Kesey, juniors; Mel Hollister and Del Evans, freshmen; started out in championship form by defeating the Roseburg Indians 36-12. The next meeting was a much closer event, however the Millers came out on top, winning by a score of 26-18.

Lebanon was the team which proved too much for the hard-fighting grunt and groaners from Springfield. In the first contest the Millers were defeated by a 32-14 count, but in the second meet the Springfielders, trying to avenge their first defeat, were barely edged 28-22.

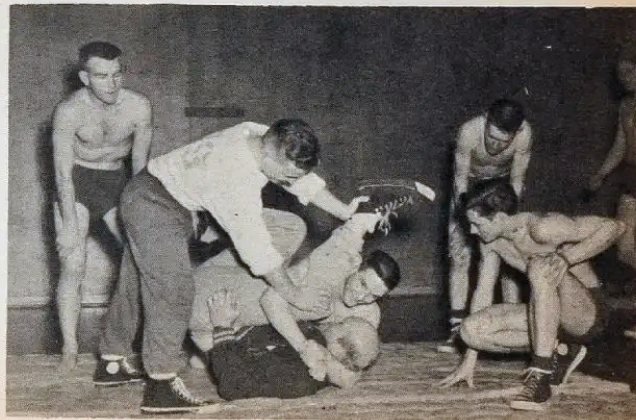
The Albany Bulldogs, proving they were almost a match for the Millers, were barely edged by Springfield 22-20 in the first meet and 24-22 in the next. The Millers boasted two rather easy wins from Corvallis by scores of 42-10 and 40-12. The Salem Vikings however handed the Millers their worst defeat by beating them to the tune of 42-14.

Ken Kesey clamps Corvallis wrestler as referee Bob Williams watches.

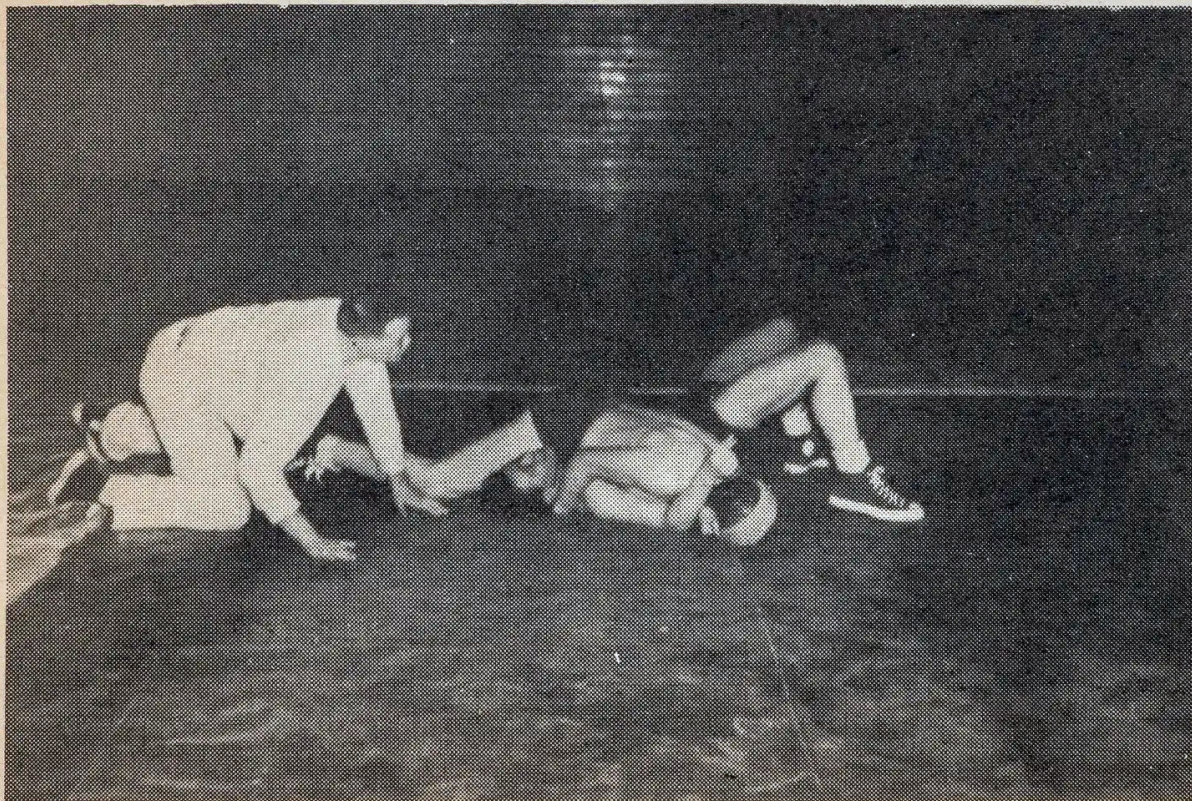


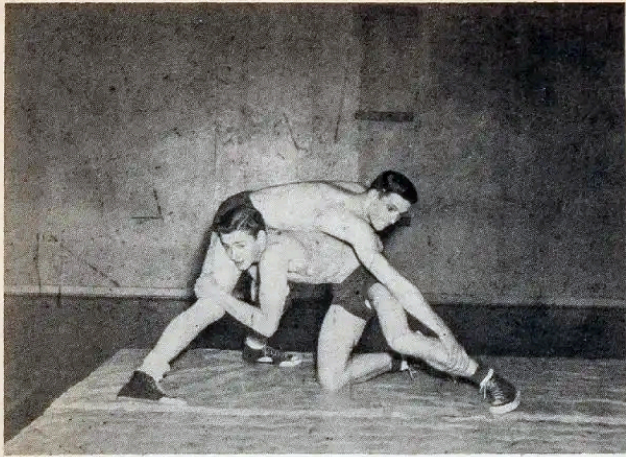

Student Coach Chuck Crone showing Doug Williams a new pin hold as Dick Tirrell, Wayne Harvey, and Pete DeLorme look on.

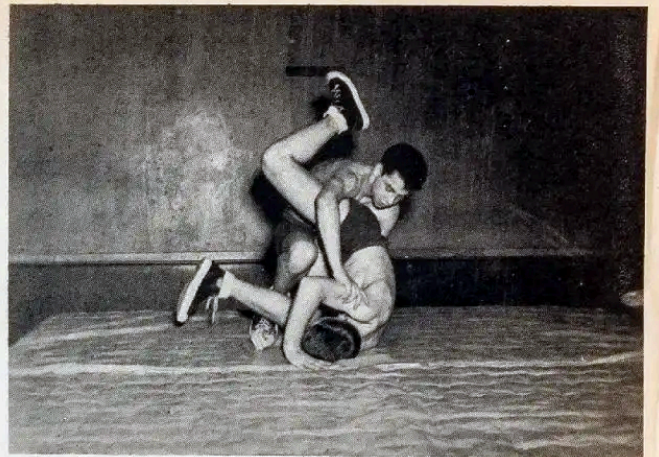

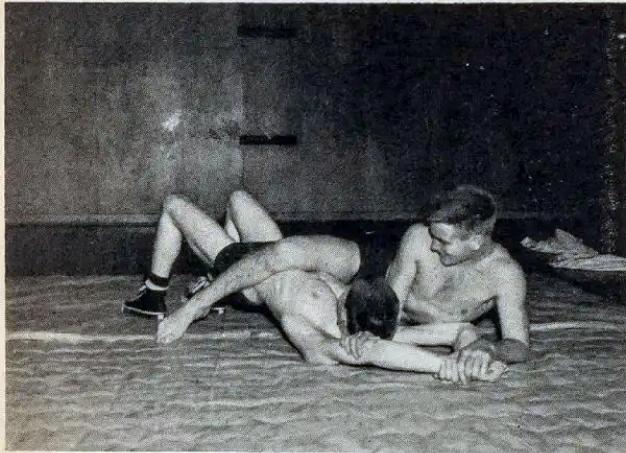
Pete DeLorme tries a leg dive on Doug Williams.



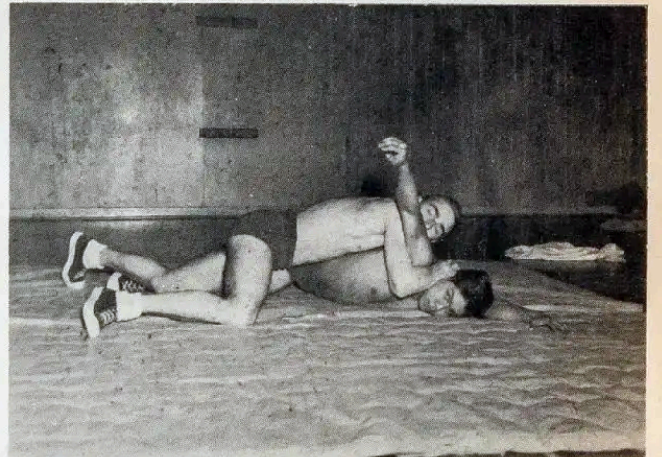
Walter Gossler showing one way of pinning an opponent.

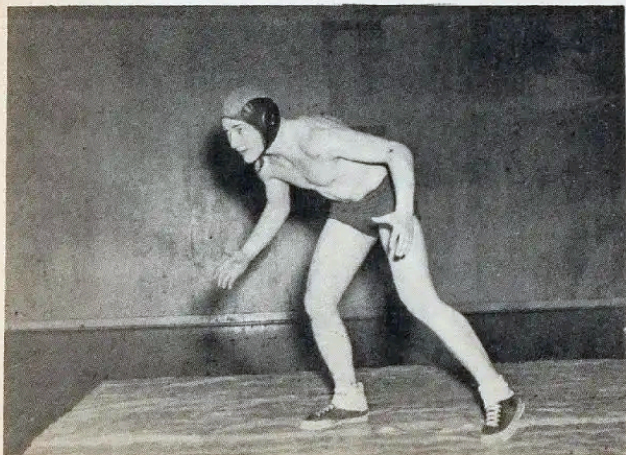

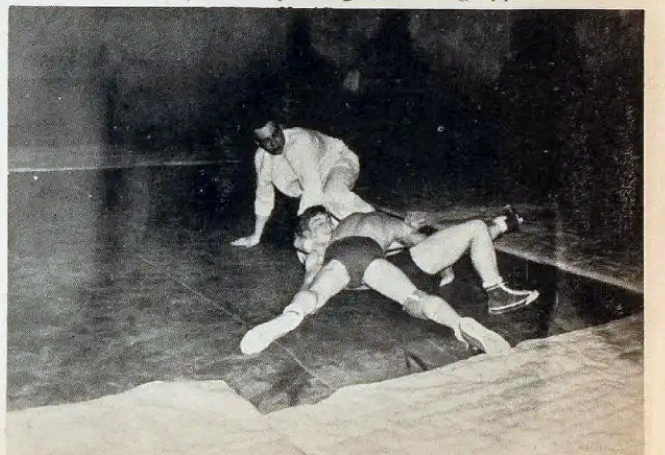

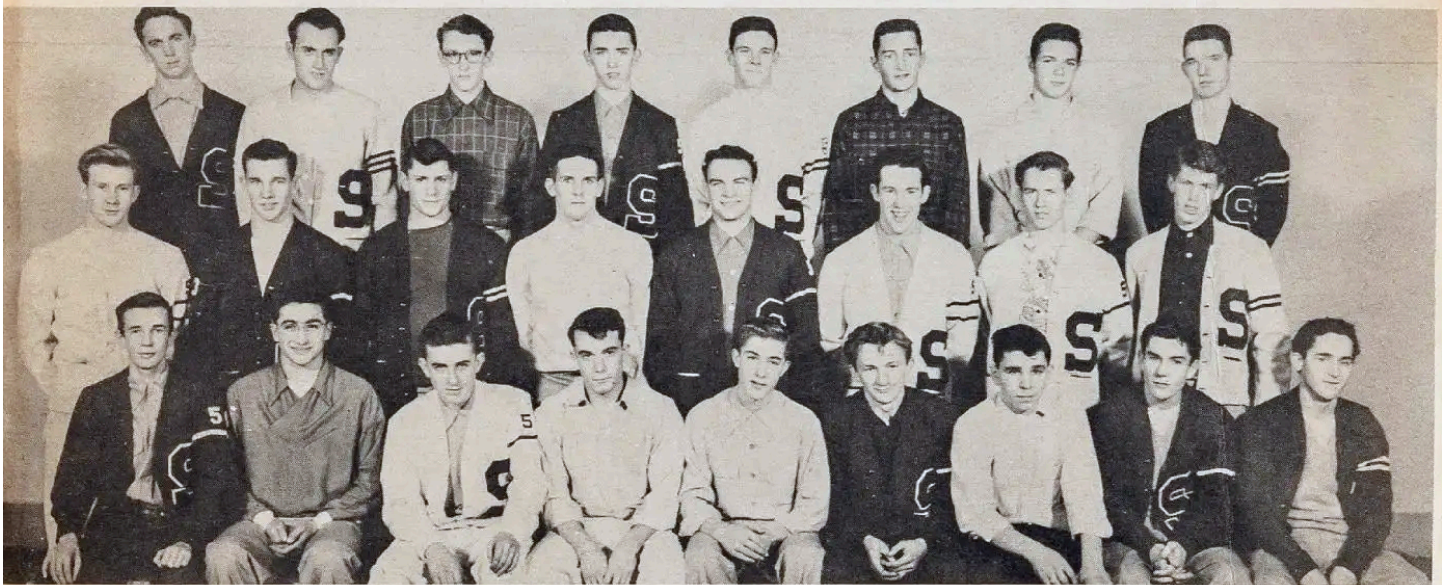
Varsity S
