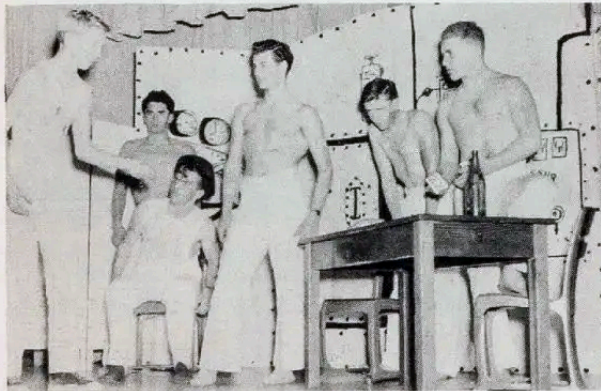

With a membership which includes every girl registered at Springfield High, the Girls' League has more than kept its 600 members entertained and busy with a host of activities including social events, service projects, conferences and services to individual girls.

Traditional social events included the Big and Little Sister party which began with a pot luck supper and ended with a style show, frolic, and dancing in the gym, a winter party, Frosty Fantasy; Merry Maids of March at which girls entertained their mothers and women friends with original skits, costume parade and refreshments; teas; Print and Cord dance sponsored jointly with Boys' Alliance, and a gala Senior breakfast at which time a cup is always awarded to

the girl voted by all girls and women teachers to be most outstanding. The Girls' League Scholarship and other awards are also made at the breakfast.

Service was given in a number of projects for community and Junior Red Cross and in maintaining a Lost and Found Department for students and a Girls' League room where sick girls are cared for and committee and council meetings held.

Girls' League meetings, held once a month, offered a variety of interesting programs both entertaining and instructive. Awards were made each month to girls selected as "Girls-of-the-month" for their cooperation, service, friendliness, citizenship, and other fine qualities.

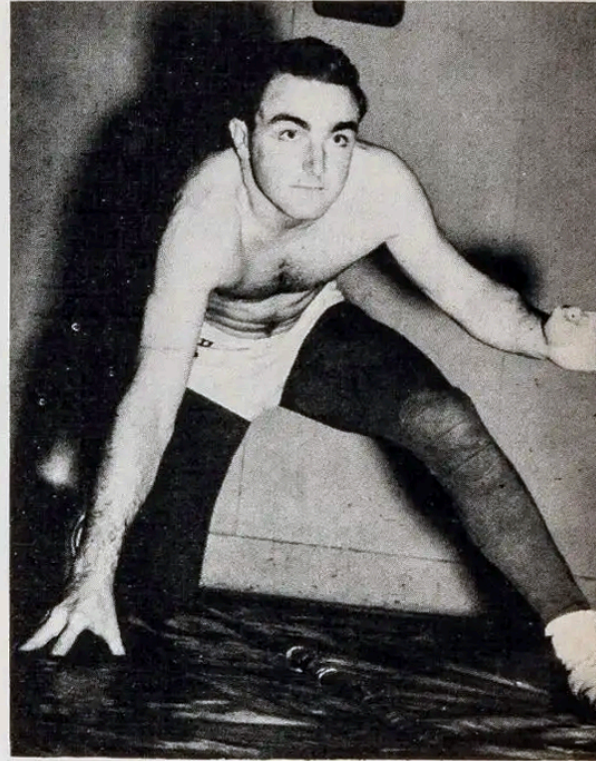
